## **Kealakehe Elementary School Computer Use Rules:**

## Kealakehe Elementary School students

- must treat their device with care and never leave it in location where it could be taken or damaged.
- must keep battery charged
- > must keep their device clean and must not touch the screen with anything (e.g. pen, pencil, erasers, etc..) other than specially made computer screen cleaning cloths.
- > must ensure that their chromebook is not exposed to any water, dust, dirt, or extreme heat
- > must always use their chromebook on clean, flat, hard surfaces so that air can circulate
- > must never use their chromebook on wet surfaces
- > will never eat or drink near their chromebook.
- must carry their device carefully with two hands and lid closed
- > will take care when inserting cords, cables and other removable storage devices to avoid damage to the ChromeBook ports.
- > must promptly report any problems with their Chromebook to one of their teachers.
- > may not remove or interfere with the serial number and other identification.
- may not attempt to remove or change the physical structure or appearance of the Chromebook,including the keys, screen, touch pad, camera, or power adapter and cords.
- must never apply stickers, marker, tape, paint, whiteout, or any adhesive to the chromebook, its power adapter, or cords. An exception is made for "post it" brand removable notes.
- > may not attempt to install or run any operating system on the Chromebook other than the Chrome OS operating system supported by the school.
- > may not reset the Chromebook
- > may not disable, or tamper with any of the Chrome account settings or software.

- > may not use or allow another to use their chromebook for commercial or political use.
- must not share passwords

Additionally, students will abide by rules of network etiquette and NOT

- > send or display offensive messages or pictures
- ➤ use obscene language
- > utilize their ChromeBook to harass, insult or attack others
- > violate copyright laws
- use another's id/password

## Web and Social Media Guidelines
