
Ruth Bader Ginsburg changed her country with her confidence to make it equal between girls and boys to get equal kindness and money.








Supreme court


Have you ever helped your community or you saw somebody did it? Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a lawyer and a judge. Ginsburg is important because she help her

community and changed laws for rights for females.


